



Hypothermia FY 18 Debrief – Transition Aged Youth Households Prepared for the District of Columbia Interagency Council on Homelessness April 2018

- During Hypothermia FY18,¹ some **203** unique Transition Aged Youth (TAY) headed households used the CoC's family Emergency Shelters, including Youth specific Emergency Shelter Program sites.
- **4.9 percent** of TAY-headed households spent seven nights or fewer in shelter over the course of the season, while **41.4 percent** spent the entire season in shelter.
- TAY headed households spent an average of **92 days** in shelter over the course of the season.

- The majority (**88.2 percent**) of TAY-headed households served during Hypothermia FY18 used **the DC General/Hotels sites** with the remainder using only Youth-specific Emergency Shelter sites or Family Temporary Shelter sites.
