

## Hypothermia FY 18 Debrief – Transition Aged Youth Households Prepared for the District of Columbia Interagency Council on Homelessness April 2018

- During Hypothermia FY18,<sup>1</sup> some <u>203</u> unique Transition Aged Youth (TAY) headed households used the CoC's family Emergency Shelters, including Youth specific Emergency Shelter Program sites.
- <u>4.9 percent</u> of TAY-headed households spent seven nights or fewer in shelter over the course of the season, while <u>41.4 percent</u> spent the entire season in shelter.
- TAY headed households spent an average of **92 days** in shelter over the course of the season.

The majority (88.2 percent) of TAY-headed households served during Hypothermia FY18 used the DC General/Hotels sites with the remainder using only Youth-specific Emergency Shelter sites or Family Temporary Shelter sites.
