Your Right to Appeal Your Denial of Eligibility for Family Shelter or Supportive Housing

If you disagree with our decision to deny you eligibility for shelter or supportive housing, you can appeal through a Fair Hearing. Before the Fair Hearing, you have a right to an Administrative Review. The Administrative Review is optional and less formal than a Fair Hearing. If you want, you can choose to have both.

You have the right to request an appeal within 90 days after the date of your denial of eligibility.

To Request a "Fair Hearing", you need to:

- Call the Office of Administrative Hearings, at 727-8280 or send in your request in writing to the Office of Administrative Hearings, 441 4th Street, N.W., Suite 540 South, Washington, D.C. 20001; OR
- Tell a staff member where you reside that you want a Fair Hearing. By law, he or she must help you make your request; **OR**
- Call the Family Services Administration, at 541-3914, or send in your request in writing to the Family Services Administration, 2146 24th Place, N.E., Washington, D.C. 20018.

To Receive an "Administrative Review":

- You do not need to file a separate request for an administrative review. Once you
 request a Fair Hearing, you will automatically be offered an opportunity for an
 Administrative Review by the Family Services Administration.
- A notice will be sent to you notifying you of the time, date, and place for the Administrative Review.
- If you do not appear at the Administrative Review, you will still have a Fair Hearing. The
 Office of Administrative Hearings will send you a notice telling you the time, date and
 place for the Fair Hearing.

At Your Fair Hearing or Administrative Review:

You have the right to be represented by a lawyer (see below), relative, or any other
person of your choice who is not an employee of the D.C. Government and to bring
witnesses or evidence that helps your case.
