Eligible Costs	Unit application and holding fees, amenity fees, renters' insurance, vital documents, utility deposits, first month's rent, storage and legal fees, back rent and arrears, other expenses that pose financial barrier to Veteran moving into their housing	Expenses typically provided under SSVF Prevention AND expenses not covered under SSVF prevention like legal fees, mortgage assistance, childcare costs, transportation, etc.
